The Federal REAL ID Act of 2005 (HR 1268) was imposed upon Florida by our Legislature in 2008 (SB 1992).

As of January 1, 2010, you now have to provide a large amount of your papers and effects in order to renew your driver license or change your address. These papers are seized by the State and scanned into the driver license database.

If you can't find just one of these papers, you will not be able to renew your Florida license. You then become a lawbreaker even though you have no intent to do so.

We are proposing a lawsuit against the State of Florida to overturn this unconstitutional law. The 4th Amendment allows us to be secure in our houses, PAPERS, and effects against unreasonable searches and seizures. The 10th Amendment prohibits the Federal government from dictating to the States how they perform powers that are reserved to the states, such as issuing driver licenses.

REAL ID

Facts about the REAL ID law in Florida:

1. It requires you to submit:

Your birth certificate or passport, Social Security card, W-2 form, or paycheck, and two things such as your mortgage payment book, voter ID card, utility hook up order, car payment booklet, medical health care card, etc.

ALL of this is then scanned into the DMV database, which by Federal law (the same REAL ID Act) is then accessible by outside states.

2. The Florida DMV has unlawfully sold the personal info of drivers in 2003 and 2004 and was sued by the Federal government for doing so. Seven DMV employees were arrested for corruption in 2009 in one incident.

3. The law in Florida was passed solely due to the 2005 Federal REAL ID law.

4. If you don't provide the info, you risk driving on an expired license. There is no "opt-out".

5. Our state Legislature passed this bill in 2008 with only 2 members voting against it, one of whom changed their vote later.
